Officer McCargar cleared and was en route to the above location with emergency lights and siren activated on patrol vehicle 722.

17:38 Officer McCargar arrived at the above location and enter the apartment building closest to Market Street at 100 Market Street. As Officer McCargar entered the building he went up the stairs to the apartment on the left numbered 3. As Officer McCargar entered the apartment he Officer Wentworth asking for assistance in locating a breathing mask to assist in CPR. As Officer McCargar entered the first bedroom on the left side of the hallway he observed a young male child approximately 10 years old laying motionless on the floor in the entryway to the bedroom, Officer McCargar also observed another male subject in the room identified as Rick Dumas, at that time Officer Wentworth was administering chest compressions on the child. Officer McCargar immediately located the breathing mask, that is when a member of the Potsdam Voluntary Rescue Squad arrived and Officer McCargar turned over the mask to that member. Officer McCargar then began to look around the room to check for a cause of injury, while trying to get the victim to respond to verbal and physical commands. Several attempts to get a response from the victim were unsuccessful, at that time the victim did not have a pulse and was not breathing. Officer McCargar observed some swelling around the victims browline and noticed several scrapes on the victims knees, appearing to have the characteristics of a rug burn. The victim also appeared to be blue in the face.

17:44 Officer Wentworth advised Officer McCargar to notify Lt. Murray of the situation and to start taking photographs of the scene. Officer McCargar called Lt. Murray via cell phone and left a voice mail explaining the situation. Officer McCargar advised Officer Wentworth of the phone call which Officer Wentworth then advised Officer McCargar to call the PD and have Robin call Chief Tischler.

17:52 Officer McCargar called the Potsdam Police Department and advised Dispatch Schneider to call Chief Tischler as we had an unresponsive male approximately 10 years old with unknown cause of injury, while on the phone Lt. Murray called and Officer McCargar advised him of the same. Officer McCargar began photographing the scene starting in the living room and kitchen area, nothing seemed out of place. Around that time the Potsdam Voluntary Rescue transported the victim to the Canton Potsdam Hospital. Officer McCargar then began photographing the first bedroom on the left where the victim was found, then continued down the hallway to the second bedroom on the left and began taking photographs, Officer McCargar observed that there was a pillow on the floor and the bed was not made. Officer McCargar then moved to the bathroom, which was the third room on the left and took photographs, nothing seemed out of place in the bathroom. Officer McCargar then entered the third bedroom located at straight ahead at the end of the hallway and began taking photographs, while photographing Officer McCargar observed that the blinds in the window were very bent up and out of shape. After a closer look Officer McCargar also noticed the window was opened and the screen was bent in an outward direction as if someone had climbed out. At this time Chief Tischler arrived and Officer McCargar notified Chief Tischler arrived and Officer McCargar photographs from the exterior. While photographing Officer McCargar observed what appeared to be where a person had slipped in the grass jumping off the lower ledge of the above building just below the window with the screen bent outward. Upon further investigation of the ledge by Chief Tischler it was noticed that a tile on the surface of the ledge appeared to have a substantial crack as if a person had jumped down on it, Officer McCargar photographed the area and then taped the area off with police tape and secured the area.

18:34 Officer McCargar called the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Officer request a

K-9 unit respond to assist with tracking a possible suspect. Officer McCargar spoke with Deputy Corbett who stated the departments K-9 handler was off duty for the night but they would try to call him in.

18:51 Officer McCargar received a call from Deputy Ashley from the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office, Officer McCargar explained the situation and Deputy Ashley advised he is en route from Ogdensburg.

19:35 Deputy Ashley arrived and entered the taped off area below the window with his dog, at that point it appeared the dog picked up a scent and Officer McCargar observed Deputy Ashley and his dog go towards Market Street followed by SGT Bates and Officer McCargar lost site of the officers.

20:07 Deputy Ashley and his dog returned and started the search over again with the same results.

Approximately 21:45 Officer McCargar was relieved by a member of the New York State Police and began canvassing Cottage St. with Officer Wentworth in search of possible witnesses yielding negative results at that time. Upon returning to the Potsdam Police Department Officer McCargar downloaded all photographs to the photo storage drive in the evidence folder with this incident number.
